## Do you see the ego-personalities in other people? What about in yourself?

When doing this comparison between Eckhart Tolle and my work in *Unraveling Your Past to Get Into the Present* I spoke to several Ph.D. Psychologists. They told me that the work I was doing was new. One even told me: “You are developing a new system in Psychology.” The rest of them agreed.

One commented that she could see herself and knows many people who have these ego-personalities.

Can you see yourself?

I know a man who is so funny. I cannot stop laughing at his jokes. At first, I didn't realize that he is the joker: ego-personality. I see him infrequently and only last time I saw him did I realize it—it was when he was making a joke about me—I thought: he is the joker.

I am not saying that people's souls only take life seriously. The soul personality is happy and laughs but not at the expense of people: not by making fun of people. The ego-personality makes fun of people.

The soul is a giver. The ego is a taker.

When the soul laughs and others laugh it is joyful. No one is hurt. The soul plays with other souls and they laugh.

When the ego makes people laugh he is taking material from someone else's life and laughing about it: he is making fun of someone else; he is putting down someone in the joke. Someone is hurt. It is a way for the person to vent his anger or his jealousy or his complaint without telling the truth: the soul tells the truth in a nice way.
