What is the soul? What is the spirit?

These were the questions I was asked to answer. So I said, “Spirit is the world in which the soul lives without a body—spirit world. The soul is your unique self that does not die. There are no two snowflakes alike just as there are no two souls alike either. They have individuality—individual personal personalities.”

- The Old Testament Bible refers to the soul over and over again. What is most important about the man or the woman is the soul, for that is the lasting part. The essence of the man or the woman is the soul—not the body.
- Poets from ages past and present refer to the soul of a person.
- People will casually say, “I am looking for my soul mate.” Or “He or she is my soul mate.” Or “You have touched my soul.” Or “Thank you from the bottom of my heart and soul.”

I am teaching you in this blog and in my book *Unraveling Your Past to Get Into the Present* how to be—how to be your soul now, today and everyday. That is what to be or not to be means: to be the soul or not to be the soul, to be real or not to be real; to be yourself or not to be yourself: Your choice.

The ego has copycat personality traits—all negative. It imitates. It is not creative and therefore it steals, forges, copies, plagiarizes, and assumes identities—embellishes.

The soul can never truly be copied so the impostor is soon unmasked; that is because the soul is unpredictable—always coming up with new ideas—inspiration and creativity which only comes to the soul, leaving the copycats behind.

The soul is unpredictable. The ego is predictable.

The ego must steal the inspiration from another soul and call it its own in order to keep the job, the position or the acclaim—the status.

The soul is always ahead of the ego for the soul is the source of inspiration and the ego is nothing—but the imitation of the man or the woman.

Does that answer your question?
